


Worthy is the Lamb


God Will Live with His People. Worthy is the Lamb that Brings People Back into the Family of God.

Revelation chapter 21 speaks of a new heaven and a new earth, and that God will soon live among His people. It also talks about how those who don't believe will experience the *second* death, the lake of fire.

It doesn't matter *how* you interpret the lake of fire to understand that Jesus means permanent separation from God.

These prophesy scriptures can be emotionally charged and sometimes confusing, but one thing's for *sure*: Jesus spent most of His ministry talking about the here and now. Living life to the full *today*.

The book of Revelation can be seen in this light that Jesus is talking about the here and now, and that the new heaven and new earth – as well as God living among his people – coincides with His New Covenant promise that He lives in each of us that believes in Him.



Not to take away from any future hope, but rather a *holistic* view of His message to you and me. A harmonious and complete view of the goodness that God has provided.

This larger view of the ministry of Jesus on earth celebrates this New Covenant, which gives us the means to reunite our hearts with the heart of God; to live our lives as God intended rather than to be slaves to sin and the power of death. *God will live with his people.*

Both are drastic separation from the goodness of God.

He is a Worthy Lamb because He **conquered** sin and the sting of death. His victory is *ours*. We won. We live full-time with God through the power of the Holy Spirit.
